

Students from the College of Agriculture, Food, and Environment (CAFE) have gone to Thailand for internships over the last 20 years. This summer the CAFE has an opportunity for students to intern through a collaboration with Maejo University (Chiang Mai, Thailand). UK students have two options for internships:

1. Working at the Huai Hong Krai Royal Development Center (about 15 miles outside Chiang Mai). This is a project funded by the King of Thailand. This center has crop (field crops, fruits, flowers, vegetables, and mushrooms), livestock (chickens and other birds), and fish production. There are also experiments with forestry management, irrigation systems, and other agricultural systems. This internship would be from June 16 to July 30, 2017 and is available to Juniors and Seniors.
2. Working at Maejo University (MJU) in a capacity that fits with your desires. In this option, MJU would find a position working with a faculty member that fits your area of interest. The timing and length could be arranged, but it is probably most likely to occur from June 16 to July 30, 2017.

In both internships, housing is provided, along with a meal allowance. Your main cost is the airplane ticket to Chiang Mai.
